MOTION: Commissioner Millman moved that the Woodinville Board recommend that the new merged agency name be Northshore Fire & Rescue pending a successful merger vote and collaboration with staff and Labor. The motion was not seconded.

2. Merger Progress Report

Chief Ahearn presented on the benefits of a merged agency as attached hereto.

3. Merger Next Steps

Chief Ahearn reported that the Woodinville City Council self-initiated and passed a resolution in support of the merger.

Board Chair Collins reported that the intent of the joint Boards is to maintain the headquarters station in Kenmore at Station 51.

The joint Boards directed staff to look into the possibility of hiring a third-party firm to perform an independent analysis of the merger.

4. Next Joint Meeting Agenda Items

The next joint meeting will be March 16, 2021. The agenda will include all standing joint Board agenda items.

5. Executive Session



2021 Effective Tax Rate

Northshore Fire Department	Woodinville Fire & Rescue
\$1.30 per \$1,000 of assessed value	\$1.26 per \$1,000 of assessed value

If the agencies were merged in 2021, the Effective Tax Rate would be \$1.19



Northshore property owners would save a projected \$0.11 per \$1,000 of assessed value, or a reduction of 8.5% of the effective tax rate.




Woodinville property owners would save a projected \$0.07 per \$1,000 of assessed value, or a reduction of 5.6% of the effective tax rate.

Additional Aid Car days Additional cross-staffed Engine/Aid Car days Additional Aid Car and an additional days cross-staffed Engine/Aid Car




As a merged agency, we would have saved \$22,127 in overtime in February 2021.


